# MHYC Sydney Short Ocean Championship 2020 Arbitration Record 11980 Cicero v 6232 Rumba

Arbitration at Middle Harbour Yacht Club, on 29 November 2020 at 14:00 Hours.

## Cicero represented by: Mark Hellyer

## Rumba represented by: Rob Carr.

## FACTS

Evidence of the following facts was presented to the Arbitration.

- 1. Immediately after the start of Race 2, Cicero was on starboard tack and Rumba was on port tack, on a collision course.
- 2. Rumba passed head to wind and before reaching a close hauled course there was contact between Rumba's starboard side and Cicero's port side.
- 3. When it was clear that Rumba was not keeping clear, Cicero tacked in an unsuccessful effort to avoid contact.
- 4. Rumba retired.

## ARBITRATOR'S OPINION

The Arbitrator advised the parties that it was his opinion that a protest committee would conclude as follows.

- A. Rumba, while tacking, did not keep clear of Cicero, on a tack and did not avoid contact with Cicero when it was reasonably possible for her to do so. Rumba broke rules 13 and 14.
- B. It was not reasonably possible for Cicero to avoid contact with Rumba. Cicero did not break rule 14
- C. Rumba's retirement was a penalty applicable to the incident and in accordance with rule 64.1(b) Rumba may not be further penalised.

## WITHDRAWAL OF PROTEST

Cicero agreed to withdraw her protest and the protest committee allowed her to do so in accordance with rule 63.1.
